An annual report is a comprehensive report on a company's activities throughout the preceding year. Annual reports are intended to give shareholders and other interested people information about the company's activities and financial performance. They may be considered as grey literature. Most jurisdictions require companies to prepare and disclose annual reports, and many require the annual report to be filed at the company's registry.

Companies listed on a stock exchange are also required to report at more frequent intervals (depending upon the rules of the stock exchange involved).

Other information deemed relevant to stakeholders may be included, such as a report on operations for manufacturing firms or corporate social responsibility reports for companies with environmentally or socially sensitive operations. In the case of larger companies, it is usually a sleek, colorful, high-gloss publication.

COVID 19 Relief for Sport & Recreation

On April 17th, 2020 the Federal Government announced the creation of a temporary relief fund to help support Culture, Heritage and Sport Organizations to continue to operate through COVID-19.

The \$72 million identified for Sport Organizations was divided amongst NSO's (National Sport Organizations) and Provinces & Territories to distribute to their local sport and recreation organizations.

Under Yukon Government's, "A Path Forward:
Yukon's Plan for lifting COVID 19 Restrictions",
local sport and recreation organizations are
currently adjusting how they operate and run
programming. These new guidelines will likely come
at a higher operating cost than what they have been
in previous years.

This initiative will help to cover any COVID-19 related expenses that Sport & Recreation
Organizations may have incurred due to closures or may experience as they move forward adjusting and operating under new guidelines.
